### Davis College of Business Takes Lead in Planning Business Trip to Cuba



Jacksonville University is taking the helm of the First Coast's international trade, planning and educational and business-focused three-day trip to Cuba. JU's Davis College of Business Dean Don Capener wrote a letter to Cuba's Ambassador Jose Cabanas in Washington D.C. requesting that a faculty representative, two students and several business executives tour the University of Havana, the Port of Mariel and meet with Cuba officials to discuss partnership possibilities. We expect to receive

approval from Cuban officials, and the trip is planned to take place toward the end of August.

### Case Study Project in Scotland Highlights International Business Education
